

Borough Council

Minutes – May 30, 2018

Call to Order – Mr. Daly called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.

Roll Call – The following members of the Borough Council were present; Eugene Cerutti, Robert Flick, Patrick Gillette (*by telephone*), Jason Serfas, Irene Slocum, and James Daly. **Also present;** Henry Farley, Mayor; Jonathan Foster, Jr., Borough Solicitor; Elizabeth Fice, Borough Treasurer; Gil Crossett, Fire Chief; Christopher Kaiden, Code Enforcement Director; Blane Lathrop, DPW Foreman; Daniel Reynolds, Police Chief; and David Jarrett, Borough Manager.

Excused: Jessie Dekar.

Citizens To Be Heard - The following citizens addressed the Borough Council;

- Donna Hazleton, 212 North Thomas Avenue – Mrs. Hazelton stated that she was addressing the Council again regarding vehicles speeding on North Thomas Avenue and nothing still has been done regarding her concerns. Mrs. Hazelton stated there have been no changes to the situation and that conditions have possibly even gotten worse. Mrs. Hazelton stated that she has difficulty getting out of her driveway because of the speeding vehicles and that she has seen a UPS vehicle go through the stop sign at the intersection with East Lockhart Street. Mrs. Hazelton stated she has seen the portable speed sign on the street and police vehicles parked at Mangialardo's Restaurant but the vehicles slow down and then speed up again after they pass the sign. Mrs. Hazelton stated that she cannot understand why nothing is being done to address the situation.
- Charles Brown, 120½ North Higgins Avenue – Mr. Brown stated that vehicles are also speeding on North Higgins Avenue and that he saw the police department in the area earlier today.
- Elizabeth Hazelton, 212 North Thomas Avenue – Ms. Hazelton stated that she is confused why something has not been done to address the concerns her mother has brought to the Borough Council. Ms. Hazelton stated that the portable speed sign has not helped and that her friends have had close calls with almost being hit by speeding traffic. Ms. Hazelton stated that she and her mother would not be at the meeting if the speeding was not happening and she hopes that the Borough Council will come up with a solution for the problem.
- Carol Fenton, 104 Tioga Street – Ms. Fenton stated that she can hear the vehicles and motorcycles speeding on Thomas Avenue from her home on Tioga Street.
- Bradley Bailey, 214 North Thomas Avenue – Mr. Bailey stated that he doesn't trust the traffic on the street and that he won't ride his bicycle on North Thomas Avenue anymore because of the speeding vehicles.
- Donna Hazleton, 212 North Thomas Avenue – Mrs. Hazelton addressed the Borough Council a second time and stated that she doesn't feel as if she is being protected and that she needs the Borough Council's help. Mrs. Hazelton stated that dump truck traffic has increased on the roadway and that they are also speeding, and nothing positive has happened even though she has talked to everyone on the Borough Council.

Mr. Flick asked Mrs. Hazelton if she or any of the other concerned citizens have written a letter to State Representative Pickett or Senator Yaw asking them to

support the proposed legislation that would allow municipal Police Departments to use radar for traffic enforcement and Mrs. Hazelton stated that she did not write a letter.

Chief Reynolds explained Pennsylvania is the only state in the United States that does not allow municipal police departments to use radar and he explained the procedures for using VASCAR for traffic enforcement and how it can be difficult to maintain the required 200 feet of clear site on Thomas Avenue as well as some other streets in the Borough.

Mayor Farley provided Mrs. Hazelton with a copy of the letter he received in response to his request for her support of the proposed legislation.

Mayor Farley also reported that the Sayre Business Association has re-organized and that a Board of Directors was elected and the organization's first event will be held on June 30th in conjunction with an event at the Sayre Historical Society Museum.

Approval of Minutes – The minutes of the regular meeting held on April 25, 2018 and the special meeting that was held on May 2, 2018 were approved as presented.

Correspondence Report – There were no questions or comments.

Finance Report – There were no questions or comments.

Committee Minutes – There were no questions or comments.

Elected & Appointed Official's Reports – There were no questions or comments.

- d. Approval of request submitted by the Sayre Business Association to close Desmond Street between West Packer Avenue and West Lockhart Street between 10:00am and 4:00pm and to use Howard Elmer Park during the same time period for a community event as recommended by the Public Safety Committee.
- e. Approve the closure of West Lockhart Street between Hopkins and Brock and South Hopkins Street between West Lockhart Street and the High School Parking Lot on Friday, June 8th during the graduation ceremony.
