There will be plaques going up on each mural which will tell a bit about the design as well as more in-depth information about both the mural subject and the artist for each mural.



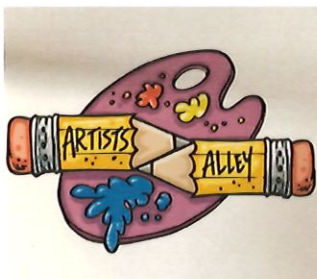
