

NEW AERIAL TRUCK PURCHASED

The Borough Council approved the purchase of a 2022 Pierce® Velocity 100' Rear Mount Aerial purchased from Glick Fire Equipment through Pennsylvania's COSTARS purchasing program at a



cost of \$1,231,000.00. The design of the new aerial truck was developed by the Borough's two fire chiefs and other officers of the Sayre Fire Department who were appointed by the Borough Council to serve on the Truck Committee. The Committee spent nearly 10 months working the design and mechanical specifications before submitting their recommendation to the Borough Council on the design of the new

aerial. The new aerial truck will replace the Borough's 1996 aerial truck and will be stationed at the Borough Hall and staffed 24/7 by the Borough's full-time and per diem drivers. The new aerial truck will be delivered prior to Labor Day in 2022 and placed into service after department personnel have completed training on the new aerial truck.



INDEPENDENCE DAY WEEKEND FIREWORKS DISPLAY

The Borough will be presenting an Independence Day Weekend fireworks display on Saturday, July 3rd at 9:30pm. The fireworks display will be shot from a closed location in the Borough and the display should be visible throughout the area but most visible in the downtown and along the railroad tracks. RECYCLING CONTAINER DISTRIBUTION

The long awaited distribution of recycling and yardwaste containers is scheduled on Saturday, June 26th from 8:00am to 3:00pm and Monday, July 12th from 4:00pm to 7:00pm at the Borough's Equipment Storage Facility on East Hayden Street. Three (3) recycling containers and three (3) yardwaste containers will be provided to Sayre Borough residents with proof of residency while supplies last.



BOROUGH PROJECTS AWARDED GRANT FUNDING

State Senator Gene Yaw and State Representative Tina Pickett recently announced \$475,000.00 in grant funding for two Borough projects. The Borough was awarded a \$375,000 grant for the first phase of the downtown streetscape project and a \$100,000 grant for the third and final phase of the Diahoga Trail project. The downtown streetscape project is a multi-year project that includes new sidewalks, curbs, bump-outs and other improvements, and the third phase of the trail project will extend the existing trail from South Higgins Avenue to North Thomas Avenue along the top of the Borough's levee system. Both projects are scheduled for completion in 2022.
